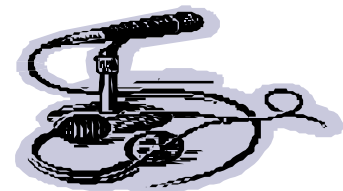
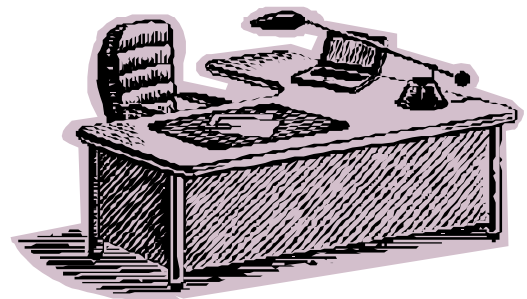
Hello!!!!!!!!!!

ECPAAA Minutes - Tuesday - March 21, 2006 Meeting

Meeting was called to order at 7:10PM by Rose-Marie. Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance led by J. R. Goad. Pledge to Texas Flag led by Mark Merrick. No Visitors present.

Motion to approve February minutes made by Tim Stinneford. Seconded by Nancy Kraft. Passed.

Discussion was held regarding Treasurers Report. It was mentioned we had reported a bounced check which incurred fees. Teresa explained that the check was received as payment for a brick sale and the party will be contacted and asked to make the check good and cover the fees. Motion to approve was made by Tim Stinneford. Second by Susan Vest. Passed.

David Mishkin asked a question regarding the by-laws changes that are currently being reviewed by the board. Was there any reference to prayer before the meeting? Rose-Marie responded that no there was not.

Committee Reports:

Membership - Total paid members including one received this meeting is 61.

Hospitality - No Report

Fund-raising - Casino night is being reviewed and we will have report at next meeting.

Currently we have brick orders but to offset the cost of shipping we are holding off the order until we can order at least fifty. Need more brick orders.

Board is still in process of reviewing the proposed by-laws. Once the board has completed this task, they will be presented to the membership for review.

Regional Update - Wes reported he had missed the last meeting which was held in Duncanville due to CERT. Wes had printed the March Newsletter and had copies for our review. You can also view their website at CPAANT.org. The next meeting will be in Fort Worth and the May meeting will be held in Cedar Hill. The June meeting will be held in Eules. The meetings are held in the surrounding cities on the first Saturday and Wes

has offered to take anyone who is interested in attending. Just give him a call. The state convention will be held July 19 in Richardson. Need to register now. Information is available on the CPAANT website, or you can contact Wes. Wes also announced that one of the directors in Fort Worth is having a covered dish social on April 29. Any member and their families are welcomed.

Nancy Kraft shared an idea on brick sales. We might generate more sales if we allow those who purchased the bricks to keep them for installation at their homes. It was also suggested the bricks shaped like the state of Texas. An example was given that Morrisdale residents purchase bricks and put them in the gazebo in their neighborhood.

J. R. Goad report that CRUD day will be held Saturday, April 22. He passed around a sign-up sheet. Start time is 8:30AM.

Cpl. James Gordon was the acting liaison for the meeting.

Cpl. Gordon reminded everyone of the COP class to be held March 25th in the PD Training room 9A-12N. Cpl Gordon will be working with Gary in the class.

A Child Safety event will be held on Friday, May 5. Volunteers are needed. Time will be 10A-2P. Target parking lot is the current location but there is a possibility it may be moved. If you are interested in helping, please contact Cpl. Gordon at x1686. The Eules PD has won an award in the US and received grant money for this service. Texas law requirements are children up to 36" inches tall must be in child seat. National law requires a child 40 to 80 lbs be in a booster seat to give them the height to fit in the seat belt. Eules has booster seats in storage that need to be given to the citizens. Cpl. Gordon advised that the PD needs to have child seats on hand to transport children when needed. Cost of a good seat is \$50 - \$60 dollars and is good up to 65 lbs. Most seats are only good from 20-40 lbs.

PAL's summer camp will be held June 5-9th and 19th thru 23rd. Open to citizens of Eules or children of City employees. Need volunteers to help. Hours are 8:30A - 12:30P. Children meet at Texas Star. They have a snack breakfast, lunch, drinks and a T-Shirt

to wear each day. Some of the many activities are Bicycle Safety, Ice Skating, Bowling, and other events at the Wilshire Pool. The Fire Department comes on the last day and gives them information on Fire Safety. The majority of the children are recruited from the local elementary schools. Mark Merrick has worked at the camp with his son and he attested on how much the kids love all the attention they receive. This is their week and I am sure they go away with many fond memories and important life lessons.

David Mishkin shared something that is now Texas Law incase anyone is not aware. A child under 60days old can be left at the City Library, Fire Department or Police Department without prosecution. This is offered in hopes that the infants will not be abandoned in places where they may not be found in time to save their life.

Linda Martin advised that Mike Brown will be running for City Council. He was to run against Veva Lou Massey, however, she decided not to run for re-election. Linda also reported that Chief Carmack has announced that he will retire in August.

Rose-Marie advised we had slots open for April refreshments. Kay Goad, Leah Bennett and Joyce Humphrey volunteered. Ann Zimmerman made a motion we adjourn. Wes Weeks seconded. Meeting adjourned - 8:15PM
