Spotlight on Cynthia Schmidt

Cynthia Schmidt joined ECPAAA from CPA Class 28, and she brings with her an extensive association with the military. Currently, she is a supervisor at Contract Claims Services, a third-party administrator for federal workers' compensation claims; her department now serves the Navy Personnel Command/MWR and the U.S. Coast Guard Units. Before she was given this responsibility, she supervised the U.S. Marine Corps/MCCS Unit.

Cynthia was born in Nacogdoches, Texas, and has lived in Euless for five years. She has a nine-year daughter who is in the Gifted and Talented Program at South Euless Elementary. As a member of a blended family, Cynthia herself is one of ten children. The majority of her family lives in



the DFW and Houston areas, and several of them have retired from and/or are currently serving in the U.S. Marine Corps – "Semper Fi!"

Her primary non-work activity is supporting her daughter's extracurricular activities. She also enjoys gardening, reading, music, creating art using different artistic mediums, trying new restaurants with family and friends, baking and target practice with her father, a former Marine sharpshooter.

Her favorite books are <u>Frankenstein</u> by Mary Shelly and <u>The Bell Jar</u> by Sylvia Plath. She prefers biographies and autobiographies about artists, musicians and/or anyone who has led and enjoyed an interesting life. She also likes books related to science and medicine.

She indicated that it was hard to select a favorite movie since she sees mostly Disney movies with her daughter. However, she likes documentaries and horror/action movies. She wrote that she gets "giddy with anticipation for any new Tim Burton movie that is released" because she loves his directorial style.

She wrote that she enjoyed her CPA classes and her favorite one was the drunk-driving exercise because she enjoyed learning about the physiological effects of being drunk with the special glasses and golf cart simulation. She also enjoyed the street crime class where she learned a lot about our local crimes and gangs.

Interesting aspects of her life that Cynthia wanted to share include the fact that she was a bartender from the ages of 19 – 22. From that position she started working for the Dallas County Medical Examiner's Office as a morgue clerk, tech and funeral home liaison. She worked there full time for seven years and still works there part time as needed. She wrote that she has seen thousands of deaths and loved ones of deceased persons and that she learned a big life lesson as a result – "No matter how bad life may seem, at least, you are not on the autopsy table yet. So appreciate all of your loved ones as you cannot take personal possessions when your spirit moves on to whatever higher power you believe in."

She also wanted to share that she is a "text book example of why not to judge a book by its cover." One-third of her body is covered with body art (tattoos) that she conceals during appropriate times. She does not use drugs and rarely drinks alcoholic beverages. She is educated; she is a homeowner; she is not in a gang and she describes herself as a "God-fearing member of society who is extremely hardworking and loyal to family, friends and my community." She also indicated that she is very nice and a bit shy at first. So, if you have not already welcomed her to our ECPAAA family, please do so when the opportunity presents itself.
