Are You Accidentally Attracting a Burglar?

Rob Griffin was our speaker in July. He started out as a manager for a Block Buster Video store. One day he discovered that he had a person stealing from his store. Rob decided to do his own investigating and he caught the suspect. The Las Vegas police department was so impressed they encouraged him to apply to become a police officer. There were 800 applicants and a 6 month hiring process. He believes that things happen for a reason. Rob really didn't think he had a chance, but as fate has it, he made it and became a police officer for the Henderson Police Department in Las Vegas. Now retired, he teaches classes and free classes to any organization or group on Burglary and what you can do to avoid being attracted to these criminals. In the 12 years Rob worked for the Henderson Police Department he did it all; patrol, investigation, undercover for the ROPE unit and work on the terrorist task force. He attended UNLV and taught a lot of classes, one very interesting class on lie detection testing. When his two buddies got killed his wife told him it was time to quit the police department. Eight years ago he started a part-time business and moved here to Euleless, Texas. Rob is married and has 2 boys. He had some very interesting information that we can all benefit from:

When do most burglaries happen? Usually between 9:30 am to 3 pm. Criminals do crimes of opportunity. Most common things stolen are jewelry, electronics, guns and cash to name a few. The 1st place they go is the master bedroom, then to the master bedroom closet. In Las Vegas a good portion of burglaries are done by methamphetamine addicts. Most are young, male and live in your neighborhood. Burglaries are double in the summertime, (idle hands). Rob taught us the concept of C.P.T.E.D. Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design. Here are some of the tips he mentioned:

1. Do not leave your garage door opener in your car. Burglars go through the neighborhoods trying door handles on vehicles.
2. Do not be a target; get some good lighting around your home.
3. Cut bushes down around your windows. Bushes serve as a good hiding place.
4. The back door is the most common way in. They will ring your door bell to see if anyone is at home. Set up a video on your front and back porch that's hooked to your cell phone.
5. Do not leave boxes on the curb for trash pick-up that display expensive things you have purchased.
6. Doors are easily kicked in. Reinforce your doors with 3 1/2" stainless steel screws in your door lock plate.
7. Record serial numbers on all items and e-mail it to yourself.
8. Have cameras in your home with 2 way communication. It becomes a high priority for the police if they know you have them in your home and watching them attempt a robbery.
9. Take valuables out of your jewelry box and put them in a Pringles cans or a hollowed out book.
10. Do not leave valuables in your chest of drawers.
11. If you have a safe make sure it is at least 1000 lbs or bolts to the floor.
12. If you see something, say something. You are not bothering the police department.
13. Door Stop Crimes prey on elderly and vulnerable people. Bad stuff will happen to good people, so be a good neighbor and be aware of your surroundings. Don't be complacent.
14. Have a plan. Know where your exits are. Make note of the surroundings in your area. You never know when you could be in an active shooter situation. Info: call/text Rob at 702-324-8072




Meeting was adjourned at 8:15 pm by a motion from Betty Priddy and 2nd by Faye.
