

John reviewed the topics to be discussed at the general meeting which includes voting for the 2015 Executive Board, the results of the BBQ/Auction and the appointment of the audit committee.

After thanking us for sponsoring the BBQ/Auction, Gary told us that officers have been going through a promotional testing process at the station. As a result, there will be four new senior corporals, five new sergeants and three new lieutenants. In addition, several new officers have been hired; the department has grown from 87 to 92 officers. Because of the increased numbers, the CPAAA office will have to be relocated. They plan to move the office to one of the interview rooms on the first floor in the front hallway leading to the jail. They will have a lock installed on the door.

John asked how we could be of service next year. Gary just suggested that we continue doing what we have been doing.

Jerri reviewed the proposed 2015 budget; Julie moved to accept the budget, and Leah seconded her motion. The budget will be included in the next newsletter for review by the membership.

Leah moved to adjourn the meeting, and Julie seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at 6:58 pm.

The meeting opened with a prayer and pledges to the flags of the United States and Texas at 7:00 p.m. Tim moved and Peggy seconded the motion to approve the minutes, and they were approved.

Jerry passed out the ballots to enable the membership to vote for the 2015 Executive Board.

Tony Burnett introduced Jermaine Montgomery as our guest speaker. He has been an officer in Euless since 2000 and now serves in CID. He is married with two children, ages four and seven. He also mentioned the family cat Luna, short for Lunatic. He gave a brief overview of his life as a police officer and answered several questions from the membership. Of course, one question was why he had become a police officer, and he answered that he had a strong belief in justice.

After Officer Montgomery left, Jerry Goad spoke to the membership about the need for volunteers for the Parade of Lights scheduled for December 6. This year the parade will start at the Trinity High School parking lot and end in the parking lot at the Midway Park Recreation Center/Family Life Center. Volunteers will be needed in both parking lots. Officer Scott Peterson explained the logistics that were being planned for this event. Members of the Recreation Center staff will be assisting; however, there is a need for four or five ECPAAA members to assist in the Trinity High School Parking lot and five or six members to assist at the Recreation Center. The Recreation Center parking lot is much smaller than the Trinity High School parking lot where the floats were disassembled in the past.

Volunteers were asked to report to the Trinity parking lot around 3:30 – 4:00 p.m.; they can report to the Recreation Center parking lot around 5:30 – 6:00 p.m.

Leah Benoit gave an overview of the financial results of the BBQ/Auction and thanked the committee members for their assistance. However, it was pointed out that only a few members remained to help with the clean-up and only one man, Jeremy Thompkins, stayed to help with the heavy lifting. More help was needed and will be needed in the future. These committee members decided that the BBQ/Auction need only be held every other year and that it should be held earlier in the year, perhaps in the spring.

There were a few items that were not purchased at the BBQ/Auction, and these items were auctioned off during the meeting.

John asked for volunteers to audit the treasurer's book. Kyla Oberg, Dana Nuber, Shelly Capil and Peggy Vandiver volunteered.
