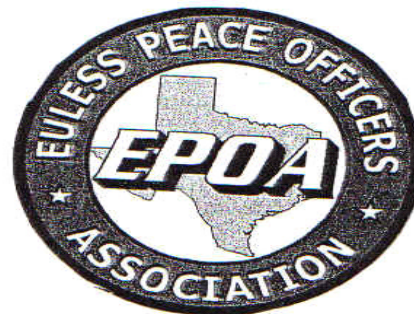

To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing to tell you about an unfolding tragedy that is happening to one of our beloved employees and friend, Tammy Barnes. Back in December of 2004 Tammy, a Police and Fire Dispatcher with the Eules Police Department for over 6 years, was diagnosed with a progressive lung disease called Pulmonary Fibrosis. Pulmonary Fibrosis involves scarring of the lung. Gradually, the air sacs of the lungs become replaced by fibrotic tissue. When the scar forms, the tissue becomes thicker causing an irreversible loss of the tissue's ability to transfer oxygen into the bloodstream. The origin and development of the disease is unknown. There is currently no treatment and no cure.

In the United States there are over 200,000 people suffering from Pulmonary Fibrosis, with 50,000 being diagnosed every year. Of that, 40,000 die annually and its victims cover a wide age span. Eventually, a person with Pulmonary Fibrosis will die from respiratory failure without receiving a lung transplant. Tammy, who is only 32 years old, had led a healthy, active lifestyle. Now her lung capacity has diminished to approximately 25% and has to rely on a portable oxygen tank 24-hours a day.

To assist Tammy with recurring medical expenses and other unexpected costs, the Eules Peace Officers Association (EPOA) and the Eules Police Benevolent Organization (EPBO) are hosting the Tammy Barnes Benefit Golf Tournament. The tournament will be held Wednesday July 13, 2005 at 1:00 PM at the Texas Star Golf Course in Eules, Texas. All proceeds from this tournament will go to a fund to assist Tammy in managing these on going medical expenses.

It is our sincere hope that you will consider participating in this worth while cause. You can help by either playing in or sponsoring this golf tournament, or making a tax-deductible donation to the EPBO in care of Tammy Barnes.
