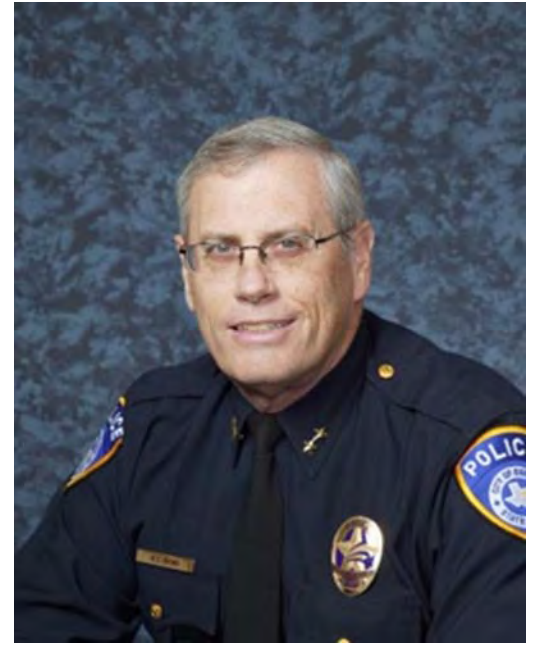


From the Desk of Chief Mike Brown

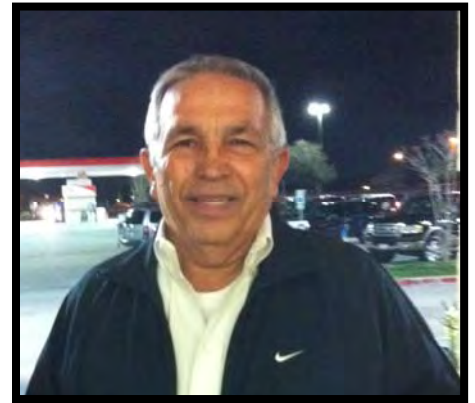

From the President — John Luna

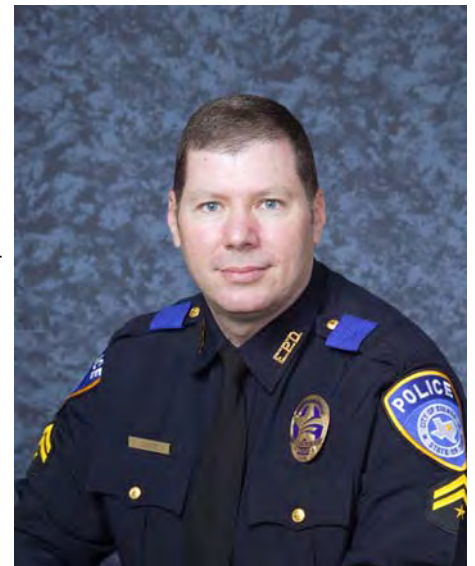

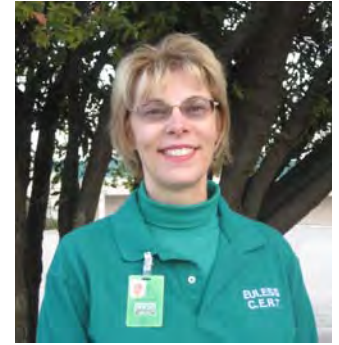
