In Memory of Perry Gates Brockmeyer

1938 - 2015

Perry passed away peacefully on Tuesday, May 19, 2015, at the age of 77. Perry was born February 26, 1938 in Kirksville, Missouri. In 1950 his family moved from Missouri to Lubbock, where he graduated from Monterrey High school, class of 1957. He then moved to Dallas-Fort Worth to attend the Dallas Institute of Mortuary Sciences where he graduated with licensing as a funeral director and embalmer in 1958. He received his certification as an EMT in 1975. Perry worked for several funeral homes across Texas. He also worked for several emergency medical services in

Texas. In 1966, Perry was called to Austin to aid the victims of the mass shooting at the University of Texas. He received his 50-year recognition pin from the Texas Funeral Directors Association in 2008. He dearly loved history and never met a stranger. Whether he knew someone for five minutes or 100 years, he always had a story to tell. We will miss you Perry!

Eules CERT Activation Drill — Search & Rescue and Triage Exercises — June 6, 2015

A call was sent out for a CERT activation drill and members were asked to report to the Leon Hogg Amphitheater in Bear Creek Park at 9:00 am. Twenty-eight members reported for the drill! During the first part of a 3-hour exercise, members were put to the test to organize a Search and Rescue for a jogger that was somewhere in the park and was reported missing by his wife. Team Five found the victim on a trail near a creek in the south side of the park. The second half of the exercise was to triage nine victims and then Assistant Chief Jeff Morris went over each victim's injuries and the correct category (delayed, immediate, minor or deceased) for each of them. Great training and we want to thank Ken Rawlinson with the Eules Fire Department for putting together the training as well as members from the Eules Fire Department and Eules Police Department for being there and watching out for our safety.



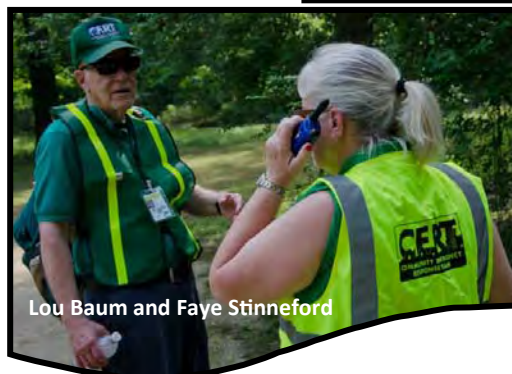

Sandi went over the proposed agenda for the general meeting.

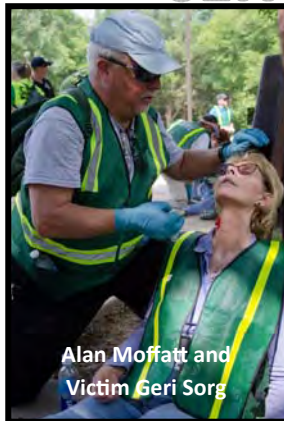
General

Sandi told us that she will miss next month's meeting as she and Pete will be spending time with family in California.

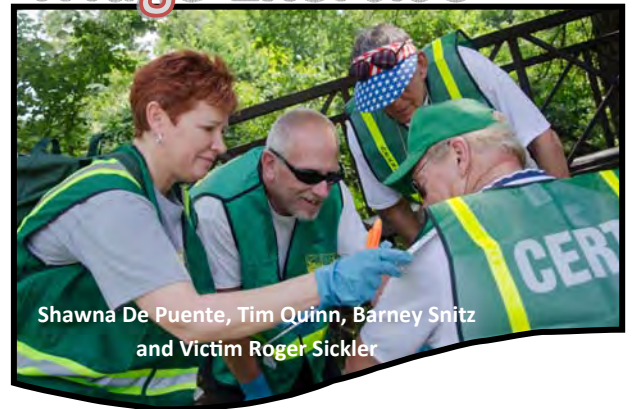
Geri moved and Faye seconded the motion to close the meeting. The meeting adjourned at 8:05 p.m.



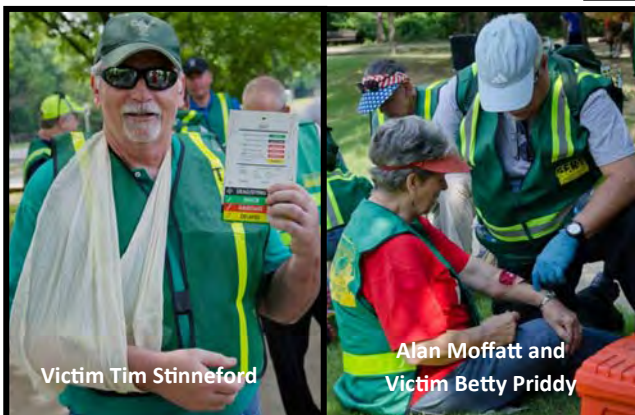

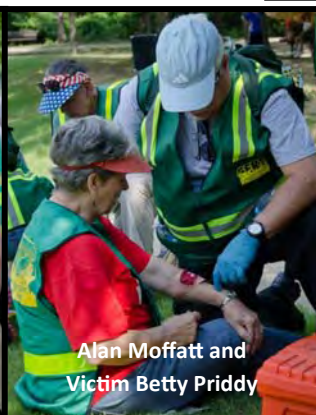
