Our first of two David Hofer Summer Camps are underway. The Mayor and I were invited to welcome the 75 campers on the first day of camp this last Monday. There were a bunch of campers who were eagerly awaiting all the excitement that this summer camp holds in store for them. I was visiting with




From the President — Julie Watkins


EULESS CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY ALUMNI ASSOCIATION Executive Board Meeting Minutes – May 16, 2017

As a reminder, the 25th Texas Citizens Police Academy Alumni Convention and Law Enforcement Training will be hosted by the City of Waco this year, August 3rd through the 5th. The registration fee for the convention is \$110, which includes all classes, 2 breakfasts, 2 lunches, 1 banquet and the \$10 Texas State CPAAA Membership Fee. Registration and payments received after June 22, 2017



must include a late fee of \$30. So if you are planning on attending, the deadline is fast approaching! Hotel rooms have been blocked for the convention at \$135.00 a night at the Waco Hilton and \$125.00 a night at the Courtyard by Marriott and the deadline to book rooms at both hotels at these rates is July 12th.
