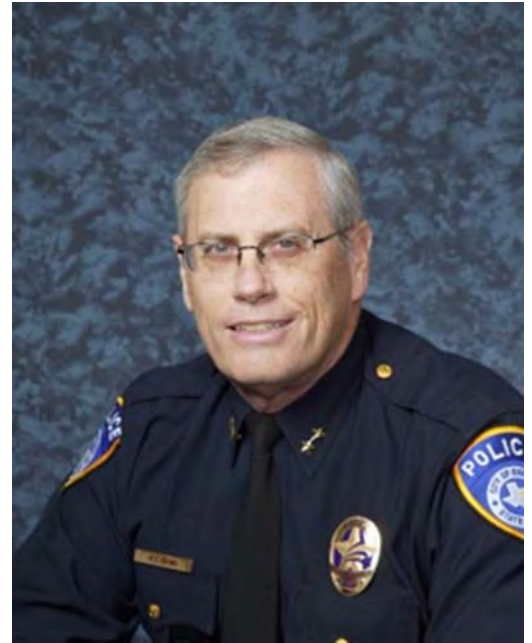

From the Desk of Chief Mike Brown

A huge THANK YOU to all of you who were able to come out and share the evening with us when we honored the tremendous servants of the Euless Police Department. It was a great night of food, friends and fellowship. That may have been the largest Awards Banquet we ever hosted. The food was great and it was truly great to get to see so many of you in attendance. If you were there then you know how special it truly was.

Getting to hear the words of Steve Lineweaver as he challenged us all to be "Uncommon Men and Women of Service!" it's great to know that he is leading the young men in his program and that a winning football program is just a byproduct of the life skills and character traits he instills in them. What is hard to realize about Coach Lineweaver is that his job is dependent upon the performance of 16, 17 and 18 year old boys. Then to know that he is more interested in their character than he is in their performance on the field, gives you an insight to why he is so successful. One of the main lessons I've learned from him is that if you care about the people you lead more than you care about what you want them to do, they'll surprise you with just how successful they can be.



If you attended that banquet, then you heard the heart wrenching story told by Arlington PD Officer Charles Ladotto when he relived the incident that almost took his life. Officer Ladotto was the officer who was shot by the suspect who was being arrested for the murder of a 6 year old little girl in Saginaw. Officer Ladotto was there to present Captain Landers and Senior Corporal Murphree with Life Saving Awards for the truly heroic efforts they made in saving his life. You could not walk away from his presentation and the story he told of that incident without having a huge sense of pride in Capt. Landers and Sr. Corp. Murphree and you had to walk a little taller because you were a member of the Euless Police Department. This was one of the most moving stories I had ever heard, I am so proud of Gary and Todd. This was a truly amazing story, and knowing that Gary and Todd were an integral part of that investigation and the saving of Officer Ladotto's life reminds us all of how important it is to be ready for whatever is coming next, even if you don't have a clue of what that might be.

We also gave out two Unit Citations. We give those to members of the department who work together either in a formal or informal work groups and accomplish some truly remarkable things. We awarded one to the Gary Gregg and Jerry Cook. Those two men are our Information and Technology section. They keep all the computers, phones, networks, radios and building security systems up and running. They always do a great job, but this year they had to rebuild our entire radio system. Every radio we have was either replaced or reprogrammed, all the antennas were replaced, all the switches and computers that serve as the backbone of our radio system was completely replaced. It was a 1.4 million dollar project and they brought it in under budget and on time. There is a lot more to that story and would make a great topic for a CPAAA meeting.

We also honored Lt. Pavlik, Lt. Neill (Ret) and PSO Lead, Daniel with a Unit Citation for their work in a Task Force that focused on the illegal sale and trafficking of tobacco products. They worked with our partners the ATF and Texas State Comptroller's Office in an undercover tobacco sting. They started this operation with no money and about 100 cases of cigarettes. Three years later they closed the operation down, filed criminal cases on 14 defendants (each defendant pled guilty once they were confronted with the evidence obtained by the Task Force), obtained restitution to the state of 2.5 million dollars in lost tobacco tax revenue and seized 5.4 million dollars from the business operation of the Task Force. Another great topic for a CPAAA meeting.

Great people doing great things!!! Thanks for all you do for us!!

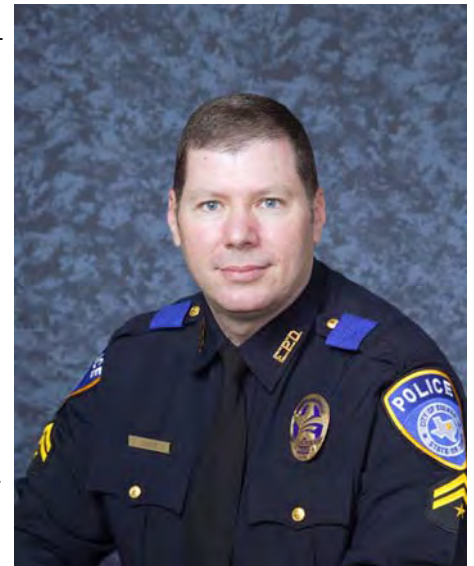


EPD Liaison — Senior Corporal Tony Burnett

I like being outside and not stuck behind a desk. I also like the excitement of the job and that every day and call is different. I like solving problems.



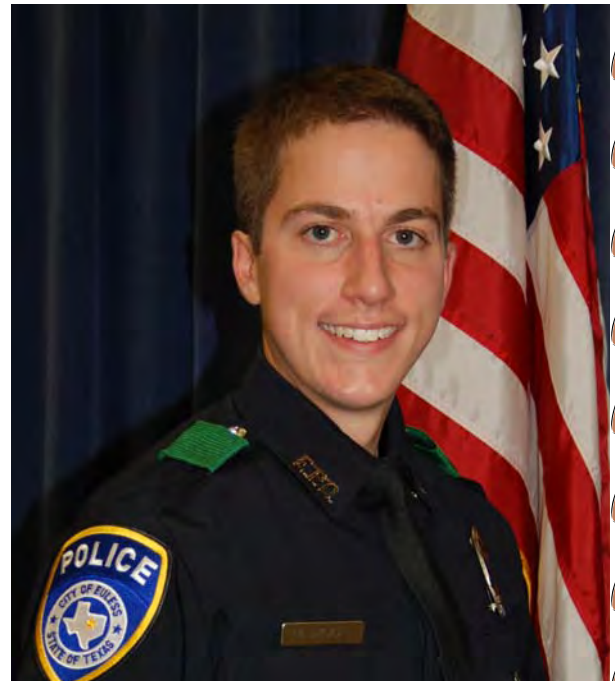

February 18, 2014**

EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING — The meeting was called to order at 6:19 pm.

ATTENDEES: Leah Benoit, Jerry Goad, John Luna, Chris Shanahan, Geri Sorg, Rose-Marie Stevens, Peggy Vandiver, Julie Watkins and Liaison Senior Corporal Tony Burnett

Committees: John proposed and it was agreed that we want to give members the opportunity to think about and sign up for a committee of their choice. A list of committees will be distributed via email.

Bricks: John confirmed that Lou Baum is responsible for making sure that the bricks are placed in the courtyard; however, another order is expected, so the bricks we now have and the bricks that are expected will be laid at a later time.

Refreshments for the Meetings: John proposed that we look for someone to coordinate the refreshments—bringing them, serving them, etc. A request will be made at the general meeting.

Having Police Officers Attend the Meetings: Tony has talked to the Chief about the idea, and the Chief endorsed it. Tony plans to start the program in March. The officers will be asked to speak for 5 – 10 minutes. Peggy said that she had already talked to four officers who have agreed to attend the meetings.

Arbor Daze: We have received an invitation to get a table for Arbor Daze. John will submit the paperwork. Arbor Daze is scheduled for April 26 and 27.

The Warrant Roundup is scheduled for March 3 – 7, 2014.

Last month, it was proposed that a mini-auction could be conducted at the awards banquet for gift cards to area restaurants; however, the Police Department decided that they did not want to promote a mini-auction. It was believed that this would send the wrong message. They believed that the gift cards the ECPAAA wanted to donate could be used as door prizes. It was decided that we would recommend to the membership that the gift cards be donated to the Police Department to use as door prizes. If the membership agrees, we will ask that the ECPAAA be given credit for donating the gift cards.

ECPAAA Website: Some of our members have an issue with the fact that the City controls our website. There is a question as to whether or not our organization actually voted to have this arrangement put into place. The Board will abide by the decision of the membership.

NEW BUSINESS

Committees: After some discussion, John indicated that he would send an email to the members with the list of committees so that they consider a preferred area of service.

Bricks: The information provided at the Board meeting was shared.

Refreshments at the Meetings: After some discussion, Leo Neal and John Koren moved and seconded the motion that we do not provide food at the meetings. This motion did not carry. It was decided that the members could bring desserts and snacks if they so choose. No formal arrangement would be made.

Arbor Daze: Julie Watkins and Geri Sorg moved and seconded the motion that we acquired a booth as we had been invited to do. Jerry Goad indicated that he had a schedule for volunteers.

Warrant Roundup: Leah Benoit asked for volunteers. She pointed out that this was a significant fund raiser for the organization. A sign-up sheet was circulated.

Treasurer's Announcements: Leah announced that there had been some success with using Craig's List to sell items as a fund raising activity. We have received a check from Safeway for \$41.71 as part of our grocery care fund raiser. Leah described how the Police Department would prefer to use the gift cards we wanted to donate to them to use at the Awards Banquet. After some discussion Jerri Balkon moved and Geri Sorg seconded the motion to donate the gift cards to use as door prizes with the proviso that they indicated that they were donated by ECPAAA.

Web Site: Some of our members expressed issue with the fact that the City controls our website. There is a question as to whether or not our organization actually voted to have this arrangement put into place. Doris Hammond said that this issue was voted on in May 2012, and it was decided at that time to allow the city to maintain our website. After additional discussion, Doris Hammond moved and Sandi Jones seconded the motion that money be returned to the budget for maintaining the website. It was decided that we would take control of our own website and that Chris would continue to maintain it.

Jerry Goad announced the following volunteer opportunities:

- Crud, April 12 – need three or four more strong volunteers who could help with lifting
- Booth for Arbor Daze, April 26 - 27
- Parade of Lights, December 6
- Open House, October 4
- Crud, September 27

Tony Burnett indicated that he would be inviting police officers to our meetings to give us the opportunity to meet them. Many of us are not acquainted with the newer officers. Tony also reported that the next CPA class is scheduled to start February 20, and they now have 17 enrollees.

Weapons of Mass Destruction: Lou Baum introduced this presentation which consisted of an informative video.

The meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m. after a motion by Tim Stinneford that was seconded by Melody Balkon.
