My first hour on duty a prisoner rolled off the top bunk in cell M-2 and busted his head on the floor. I have never seen that much blood in my life and thought "what have I gotten myself into?" On January 1, 1993 I was transferred to Patrol Division and



started my field training with Officer Joe Kraft. From 1997 until December of 2005 I worked in the Neighborhood Patrol Office and then transferred to Criminal Investigation Division in 2006. In 2007 I was promoted to Senior Corporal and really enjoyed my remaining time in CID. After a short year in patrol I came back to the Neighborhood Patrol Office in 2011. I work with some of our best officers in Neighborhood Patrol, School Resource and Code Enforcement.

In what city do you currently live? North Richland Hills

Tell me a little about your family, spouse, children (ages), grandchildren, pets, etc. I have been married to my best friend, Melissa Rhodes of Hurst, for 20 years. We have two

Who is your favorite celebrity? Matthew McConaughey


What is your favorite food? Tequila

With summer coming and school letting out it's time for our Police Activities League Summer Camp. I believe we are hosting two camps this summer. If you are interested in helping us with those camps please get with Tony or James; they can get you pointed in the right direction. We always need dedicated and motivated people to help us serve the great kids that come through our camps every summer. Even though it's only a half a day camp, I promise it will feel like you have put in a full day's work if you come out and help us.

With summer on the way we will also see an increase in our Vacation House Watch requests. I know those of you who serve as Citizens on Patrol are well aware of our Vacation House Watch program. We can always use more people driving the neighborhoods in the COP car checking on the houses that are on the list. I cannot say it enough, whenever you volunteer your time to the department



you immediately become a force multiplier, your efforts are vital to us as we strive to keep our patrol units in service and free for calls and other law enforcement activities. If you have not taken the COP course, you can still team up with someone who has and be an extra set of eyes and ears in the car. We will be expanding the role of the Citizens on Patrol program in the next few months, and now is an exciting time to come on board and work alongside the patrol officers and other first responders as they serve the citizens of Euless.

With summer coming I want to remind everyone to be vigilant at home and in your neighborhood to help us prevent crime. Remember an open garage door might be convenient for you as you are working in your yard or on the house, but it is a HUGE invitation to a criminal. Criminals see an open door as an invitation to come into you home and help themselves to your tools and other belongings. Keep your doors and windows locked at all times. If everyone in town would do that, we could cut our burglary and theft rates in half. But don't forget to apply your crime prevention training to your cars as well. Keep them locked and free from any item that might catch the eye of a criminal. If you MUST leave something of value in your car, put it in the trunk or some other storage compartment, out of sight of anyone just looking for a quick score. If people would do this one simple thing, I believe we could cut our Burglary of Motor Vehicle rate by 80%. Please remember to take care of your property and spread the word to your neighbors, just think of how low our crime rate would be if we could get everyone to adopt these simple but very effective crime prevention strategies.

We continue to hire new officers and are trying to get them through the academy and their field training program. When you get a few minutes, stop in and say hi to the new faces around here. We have brought some truly remarkable men and women into the department and I think they will blend well with all the other outstanding servants we have working here.

I wish you all a great summer, and I hope each of you will find the time to come and volunteer a few minutes with us in the coming months. I do understand how frantic it can be during the summer and how everyone would like to get away for a few days, so even if you can't come serve with us please stop in and let us know how you are doing.



I am eating breakfast with one of our Alumni members, Ken Denne, and this man approaches our table. He identified himself as a retired Air Marshall and began throwing out officers names that he knew. He stood at our table for several minutes telling us about his days as a Marshall and then a few "war stories" were told. I asked him "how do you like retirement" and he responded "if I could go back to work tomorrow, I would but it was my time to go. I love catching up with my old friends and swapping stories, we spend hours doing that and I cherish all of it". It's not uncommon for this to happen when you are wearing the uniform and in the public. A retired LEO (Law Enforcement Officer) always wants you to know that they bleed blue.

The following day I reported to my supervisor, Captain Gary Landers that a close family friend had passed away and asked for permission to attend his funeral in Richland Hills. I told Gary that I was meeting Melissa there and would not be gone more than an hour. During the service Melissa told me that she was feeling ill and asked me to walk outside with her. As



soon as we made it to the rear of the sanctuary Melissa began to fall. I grabbed her limp body and carried her into a room where I noticed that she was ash white and unresponsive. Her eyes were open and there was no response from her pupils. I told some people to call 911 and listened for a breath, no breath detected. I felt for a pulse and no pulse was felt. I remembered what James Gordon had taught us in CPR so I opened her airway and told a stranger nearby that I was going to begin CPR. A woman walked up to me and held out a cell phone, I could see that it said "911" but she said it wasn't getting a signal. I reached down and pulled out my police radio on Euless Patrol 1 and said something, I can't tell you what I said but I guess the sound of my voice said everything. My dispatcher responded and the familiar voice was comforting in my time of need. I knew that help was on the way because MY DISPATCHERS were running the show now. I went back to assessing Melissa and heard a very faint breath, then her pupils moved and then her head moved. After what seemed an eternity she asked "where am I?" She later said that the Funeral Director was the first person she saw - Ha Ha! I told her where she was and told her to lay still. A short time later an ambulance was on scene as well as Senior Corporal Scott Peterson who heard me on the radio calling for help. I asked Scott "how did you get here so fast" and he said "don't ask but I am a driving instructor". It was very comforting to see him and he later told me that nothing was going to stop him from coming. A group of officers came to the hospital to check on us and offer assistance. My phone rang most of that day with offers for assistance, prayers and well wishes. I work with some of the most amazing people, they are my second family. You are a part of this family and I appreciate all of you. I see what that Air Marshall was saying, it's not the work you miss as much as it is the relationships. I cherish the relationships.

We wrapped up our last law enforcement cadet class on April 17th. Our last CPA class is May 15th and we are looking forward to introducing our Alumni members that evening as well. Please come to the class and introduce yourself. Summer camp starts June 9th and wraps up June 20th. Thanks to all of you who helped at CRUD Day and Arbor Daze, you know who you are!! See you at the meeting.

National Police Week

A little History — In 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation which designated May 15th as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which that date falls as *Police Week*. Currently, tens of thousands of law enforcement officers from around the world converge on Washington, DC to participate in a number of planned events which honor those that have paid the ultimate sacrifice. The Memorial Service began in 1982 as a gathering in Senate Park of approximately 120 survivors and supporters of law enforcement. Decades later, the event, more commonly known as *National Police Week*, has grown to a series of events which attracts thousands of survivors and law enforcement officers to our Nation's Capital each year.
