From the Desk of Chief Mike Brown

We got through Open House and National Night Out and the rest of October with our sanity intact. It was a very busy month for us around here and we could not have made it without you taking each step of the way with us. I cannot thank you enough for the minutes that you gave us. I was fortunate to get to speak at the CPAAA of North Texas at their Chiefs Round Table. What an honor it was to be able to address CPAAA members and other Chiefs from around the North Texas area and brag on the truly awesome alumni members we have here in Euless!!! From what I heard, I think we remain on the cutting edge of how we utilize our family of volunteers.

Every morning when I get to work I witness at least two or sometimes as many as four volunteers in the station getting our fleet prepared or replenishing our supply of water. We have a few generations of officers who have NO CLUE what it's like having to deal with fleet issues every day. Years ago, when our fleet was much smaller, we would assign

a patrol officer to be the fleet guy. His duties, along with answering his calls, was to get the cars to and from the service center, radio shop, the body shop or anywhere we needed them to be in order to get them repaired. This process has only grown since those days and I figure that it would tie up at least two officers every day to get all of this done. I cannot brag enough on the guys who come in and keep our fleet running.

Rocky and our NPOs started a new program last month called Coffee with a Cop. Pretty straight forward program. They pick a different restaurant every few weeks, advertise their location and then go sit in the restaurant, drink coffee and talk with anyone who wants to come up and talk. I know several of our CPAAA members have helped to make these events very successful. Check our Facebook page for the date, time and location of the next Coffee with a Cop. You never know who you'll run into at these events. It's always worth your while. We emphasize with our officers that we are always recruiting. People are always watching and waiting to see how we handle any and every situation we encounter. The person watching might become inspired to become a Euless Police Officer because of the way we present ourselves. I believe this is true for the CPAAA too. These events are an awesome opportunity for the CPAAA to be on display. The people who come over and share a cup of conversation with us need to see that there are other citizens who feel comfortable working around and volunteering with the police. So, try to come out to one of our upcoming events and bring a neighbor or friend!!

Thanks again for all you do for us. The CPAAA is a very special group of dedicated people who make our job easier and are full partners with us in our mission to serve the citizens of Euless.


