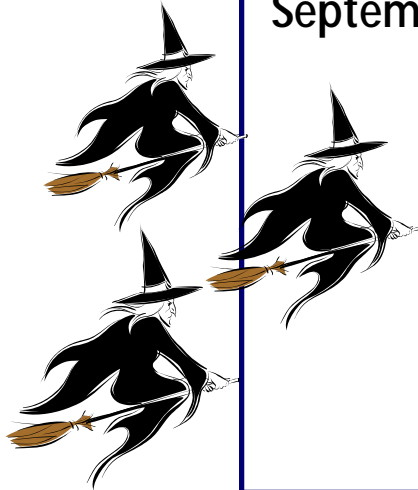

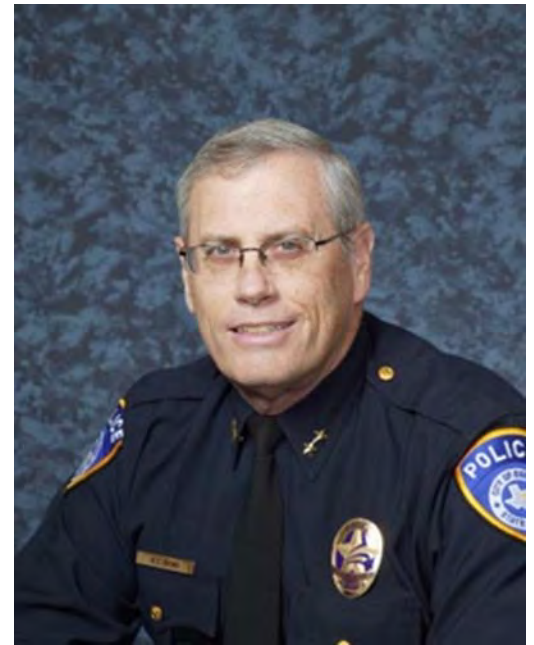

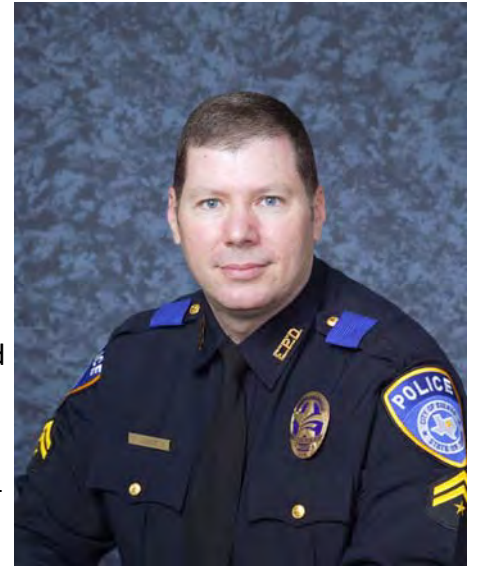

2013 ECPAAA Board Candidates Brief Biographies

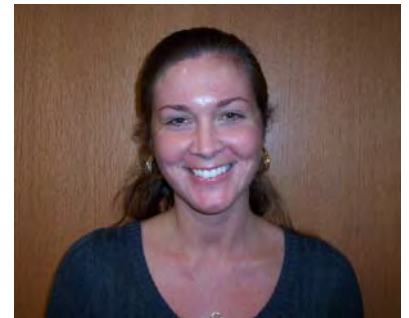
Loretta Jo Doty – Candidate for President

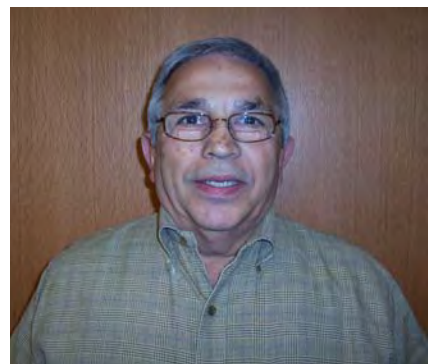
David Lawwill – Candidate for 1st Vice President

Cynthia Schmidt – Candidate for 2nd Vice President

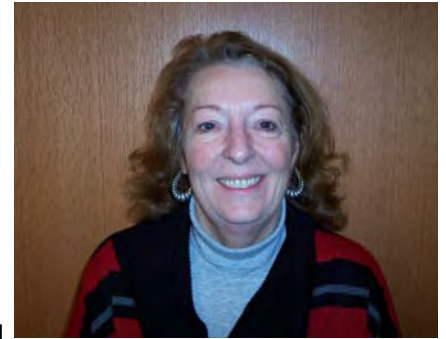

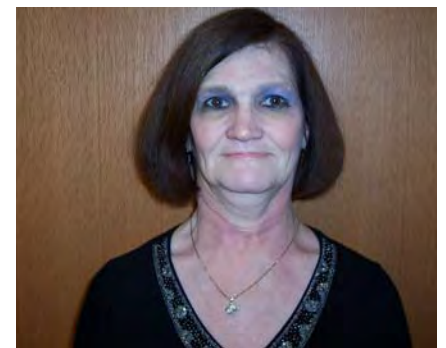
Kyla Oberg – Candidate for Treasurer
