
Grand Opening

Total – 133 Hours 15 Minutes



She purchased 26 bricks for friends and family and has been our biggest supporter.

EXECUTIVE UPDATES:

- 1. Before the 2002 Budget presentation, Leah Benoit asked Sgt. Ron Williamson to present his addition to the budget. The Police Department is asking that the Association fund the annual Summer Camps. Currently, the camps are held in Hurst, Euless and Bedford for three weeks in the Summer. Between 40-50 kids attend each camp. Euless wants to expand the program and with our NPO's providing the bulk of man-hours, the Police Department is considering severing its ties with the other cities and having all three weeks in Euless. The only concern about severing ties is that the HEB School District provides transportation for all the camps since all three cities participate. Currently, the cost is approximately \$1000 to \$1500 per week and is provided through the Crime Tax Bill. Sgt. Williamson asked that the Association budget \$3500. Many members feel that the Association should support our officers with what they want. Sara Munday mentioned that there was money left over from 2001 that had to be spent on Police activities. After much discussion, Martha Derstine made a motion to provide \$3500 from the 2001 carryover money to fund the annual Summer Camp. Second by Sharon Finnegan. Passed. (This expense will not be added as a line item to the budget for 2002.)
- 2. Leah Benoit presented the 2002 Budget. Leah mentioned that Christmas Providers was being reduced and the Thanksgiving Dinner and Fingerprinting items had been deleted from the 2002 Budget. After much discussion regarding the reduction of Christmas Providers, Sara Munday stated that we could move \$100 from Computer Hardware to Christmas Providers. Chris Shanahan made a motion to accept the 2002 Budget as presented with the \$100 being moved from Computer Hardware to Christmas Providers. Second by Dale Derstine. Passed.
- 3. Al Simmenroth & Sherrod Munday gave an update on the Calling Tree software. They are still looking into different programs. The program would be used to remind members of the meetings and for PD emergencies. Sher-


