






From the Desk of Chief Mike Brown

Summer is coming!!! With summer coming and school letting out it's time for our Police Activities League Summer Camp. I believe we are hosting two camps this summer. If you are interested in help us with those camps please get with Rocky or James, they can get you pointed in the right direction. We always need dedicated and motivated people to help us serve the great kids that come through our camps every summer. Even though it's only a half a day camp, I promise it will feel like you have put in a full day's work if you come out and help us.

With summer on the way we will also see an increase in our Vacation House Watch requests. I know those of you who serve as Citizens on Patrol are well aware of our Vacation House Watch program. We can always use more people driving the neighborhoods in the COP car checking on the houses that are on



the list. I cannot say it enough, whenever you volunteer your time to the department you immediately become a force multiplier, your efforts are vital to us as we strive to keep our patrol units in service and free for calls and other law enforcement activities. If you have not taken the COP course, you can still team up with someone who has and be an extra set of eyes and ears in the car. Now is an exciting time to come on board and work alongside the patrol officers and other first responders as they serve the citizens of Euless.

With summer coming I want to remind everyone to be vigilant at home and in your neighborhood to help us prevent crime. Remember an open garage door might be convenient for you as you are working in your yard or on the house, but it is a HUGE invitation to a criminal. Criminals see an open door as an invitation to come into you home and help themselves to your tools and other belongings. Keep your doors and windows locked at all times. If everyone in town would do that, we could cut our burglary and theft rates in half. But don't forget to apply your crime prevention training to your cars as well. Keep them locked and free from any item that might catch the eye of a criminal. If you MUST leave something of value in your car, put it in the trunk or some other storage compartment, out of sight of anyone just looking for a quick score. If people would do this one simple thing, I believe we could cut our Burglary of Motor Vehicle rate by 80%. Please remember to take care of your property and spread the word to your neighbors, just think of how low our crime rate would be if we could get everyone to adopt these simple but very effective crime prevention strategies.

I hope you all have had a chance to meet Officer Eric Fieilo, he is an outstanding young man and we are so very proud of him. For those of you who don't know Eric he is a Euless kid, grew up here and went to school at Trinity High School where he was an outstanding student athlete. But he has had to overcome a few obstacles in his life. His story is one of faith, conquering self-doubt and personal responsibility. Sandi called the meeting to order at 6:15 p.m. She went over the agenda for the general meeting. JR will start with the invocation and the flag salutes and Teresia will introduce the speaker. Old business includes: previous minutes approved; birthdays will be read and happy birthday will be sung to those attending; reminder that this is the last month to pay dues to stay in the ECPAAA. Julie will give a T-shirt order progress report and explain the 'snag' we hit and what has been done about it. JR will mention Arbor Daze and volunteers signed up and volunteers are still needed.

New business includes: Sandi will announce that Linda Eilenfeldt needs ECPAAA to volunteer for the 6 Stones Run on May 14th to act as traffic guards. Need about 30 volunteers. Work time will be from 8 a.m. until the race is completed. Sandi will send a sign-up sheet around. Sandi will bring up the need to have new committees and needs people to sign up for hospitality, benevolence, budget, audit, adopt-a-cop for both officers and 911 operators committee, and the social committee. Sandi would like for us to have social events every other month and would like for us to use the list for the thank you cards from the food provided for the Hofer Funeral for the social event locations. Sandi will also mention that Leah Bennett's request was for money to be given to the ECPAAA instead of flowers.

The meeting was called to order at 6:53 p.m. and opened with Jerry Goad leading the invocation and the flag salutes. Teresia Foreman introduced Officer Michael Nafziger who spoke to us about mapping a scene using a Power Point Presentation. He gave us an overview of a crime scene reconstruction. He explained the training levels that are available and mention that they have 4 teams on call for 24 hours for one week every four weeks. He explained when and why the team is activated. He mentioned that the equipment they use is 9 or 10 years old and they only have 2 batteries. He mentioned the difficulties they had at the Hofer crime scene because of the batteries needing to be recharged. The cost of the batteries is \$60 each and perhaps the ECPAAA should assist in the purchase of a couple of more batteries. He also showed us the new completely robotic equipment the Grapevine Police Department is using and how they brought it out to the Hofer Crime Scene because of the batteries failing and how impressive it is. He also mentioned the cost of this fancier equipment.

The meeting resumed at 7:50 p.m. after the speaker finished his presentation. The membership was asked if they read the minutes for the March Meeting. Judy Rick made the comment that she objected to the reference to boycotting KFC in the previous month's minutes. I mentioned that I recorded it just as it was said. It was also mentioned that I had misspelled Officer Hoerth's name in the minutes. Teresia Foreman made a motion that we pass the minutes from the March meeting with the correction of the Officer's name. Molly Maddox seconded the motion; motion passed.

The question was asked about another COP class and it was mentioned that the training only takes about 30 minutes and Rocky or James Gordon can train you. There are 23 people receiving the national award this year.

Sandi Jones mentioned that Linda Eilenfeldt needs 30 volunteers for the 6 Stones Run on May 14 at 7:45 a.m. until the race is over. Volunteers will be used at intersections to give directions to the participants. JR Goad reminded us about Arbor Daze this weekend. It will take place off of Midway Park near the Senior and Recreation Center this year. Check with JR if you signed up and need to know what time you are signed up for on Saturday. We still need someone to sit at our information booth from 8 to 10 p.m. Loren Johnson mentioned that there are still spots open for the Sky Tower. See Loren if you need to know what time you signed up for or if you are interested in signing up for the Sky Tower. JR also mentioned the upcoming activities for the Open House, the fall CRUD date, the Trinity Homecoming Parade and Christmas Parade.

CPAANT HOST: Arlington CPAAA

April 2, 2016

There were approximately 45 people in attendance representing 19 Member CPAAA's. Our speaker was Lt. Brook Rollins, Arlington PD Technical Services Division. Lt. Rollins spoke on Unmanned Aircraft Systems. He explained the differences between users/owners of an UAS unit and the very strict rules that police agencies have to adhere to versus a private citizen flying a unit. The Arlington PD is one of the first in the nation to obtain a Certificate of Authorization (COA) to fly in a congested air traffic area.
